Collision Association Partners with Two Local Non-Profits to Bring Vehicle Donation Program to Connecticut *Four Families in Need to Be Served*

Rocky Hill, CT July 27, 2009 — The Connecticut Collision Repair Specialists Association, a member of the National Auto Body Council (NABC), is pleased to announce “Recycled Rides,” a vehicle donation partnership with two Connecticut non-profits: *Hands On Hartford* and *New Haven Home Recovery, Inc.* The first cooperative program between the three associations, the program is a community awareness project in which members of NABC will repair and donate recycled vehicles to four Connecticut families in need. Both participating organizations will help CCRS locate individuals in transition who need reliable transportation.

The program kicks off today, and four qualifying Connecticut families will be announced and awarded their cars on “Rideaway Day” on November 23rd 2009. This statewide effort is part of NABC’s Recycled Rides program across the country. On that day, nearly 150 cars are expected to be donated nationally.

“We are excited about participating in Recycled Rides,” states Doug Sudell, CEO of Hands On Hartford. “It’s an opportunity to help individuals who need a vehicle to fully transition into a job situation and provide for their families.”

KellyAnn Day, Executive Director of New Haven Home Recovery, Inc. said, “CCRS has a history of helping those in need in our community, and we’re proud to be a part of this program.” We’ll work diligently to find the perfect match for these donations.”

“Our goal is to help people in our local community,” states Lisa Siembab, CCRS Executive Director. “We decided to utilize the NABC program because they have a great toolkit that guides us through the entire process. Together we can have an effect right here in our community *and* across the country. Within our association, we have more than a dozen member shops who will participate, and many suppliers who will work together to restore the vehicle for four families in Connecticut.”

Siembab added, “Each year collision repair operators all over the country come across cars that are ‘written off’ by either the owner or the insurance company. Many times all these vehicles need is some TLC or mechanical and body work to get them road-ready and safe to drive. We decided to join this national effort, The vehicles were generously donated by CCRS member Enterprise Rent-A-Car, and other partners within the industry.

Hands On Hartford is a Hartford-based private non-profit, non-sectarian social services agency that works in partnership with others to “strengthen community in Hartford by responding faithfully to people in need through programs that change lives and renew human possibility.” The agency operates school-based educational programs for children and their families, residential and supportive services for people living with HIV/AIDS and a variety of basic needs programs (soup kitchen and food pantry, resource and referral services, weekend dining and meals-on-wheels programs for seniors and the disabled). Founded as Center City Churches, the agency changed its name to Hands On Hartford in 2006 and became the first social service agency recognized as an affiliate of Hands On Network – a 250-member national organization intent on mobilizing and redefining volunteerism and civic engagement throughout the nation.
